


Kyushu in Asia


Linking with major cities overseas

Semiconductor production with high added value

Sony Semiconductor Inc., known for its CMOS image sensors used in cameras for smartphones, the Renesas Group, known for its motor vehicle integrated circuits (microcomputers), and Mitsubishi Electric, known for its power semiconductors used in household appliances and automobiles, also own factories located in Kyushu.

Concentration of biotech businesses, universities & research institutes

Kyushu is blessed with an abundance of agricultural, forestry and fisheries resources. In addition to its traditional industry in the fermentation of miso, soy sauce, shochu wine, etc., the region has a concentration of biotech businesses and university research organizations in industries such as the field of health food.


The Kyushu Regional Biocluster Plan was initiated in 2007 in an effort to facilitate industrial development through leveraging these regional advantages. It aims to build a safe and secure "Food and Health Island Kvushu" through providing functional foods and health foods in collaboration with the preventative medicine and services industry

Concentration of businesses in pollution control. energy conservation & recycling and solar power generation technologies

Based on its experience of facing serious pollution issues in the past. Kyushu has focused great effort into environmental remediation and preservation through government and private collaboration efforts. As a result it has created a concentration of a large number of businesses possessing highly advanced pollution control technologies. In


recent years, a significant number of businesses have grown in the field of recycling technologies developed through treatment of agricultural and Oscillation 2% livestock wastes.





01 Mt. Aso (Aso City, Kumamoto Prefecture) Mt. Aso is home to the world's largest caldera, the caldera containing Mt. Naka continuously emits clouds of smoke. The somma enclosing the caldera offers a pramic spectacle of nature

02 Fukuoka Tower (Fukuoka City)

The Fukuoka Tower, a symbol of Fukuoka City, boasts a height of 234m, the highest seashore tower in Japan. Right next to it, stands the FUKUOKA YAFUOKU! DÓME where more than 70 official games are played in the professional baseball season.


05 Takachiho Gorge (Takachiho-cho, Miyazaki Prefecture)

(Takachino-cho, Miyazaki Prefecture) Takachiho Gorge consisting of 100m cliffs created by the erosion of Aso lava is famous for its rocky formations and foliage. The Manai waterfall cascading into the gorge is exceptionally beautiful and the waterfall has been selected as one of the One Hundred Waterfalls of Japan.

O6 Yakushima Island, a World Natural Heritage (Yakushima-cho, Kagoshima Prefecture)
Island providing solace with its Yakusugi cedar trees more than 1000 years old. It became Japan's first UNESCO World Natural Heritage.

12 Hakata Yamagasa (Fukuoka City)

A traditional festival of merchants that continues for more than 700 years. In the early morning hours of July 15, the last day of the festivities, an exciting and dynamic event known as "oiyama" takes place, in which groups carrying portable shrines engage in a time race.

13 Saga International Balloon Fiesta (Saga City)

This is an annual hot air balloon international festival held in Saga City in early November. Over 100 hot air balloons with beautiful colors and patterns drift up in the late autumnal sky above the Saga plain.

14 Nagasaki Lantern Festival (Nagasaki City) Held for about 2 weeks to celebrate New Year's Day by the Old Calendar (the Vernal Equinox), the main venue is the city's Shinchi Park in Chinatown and the streets are adorned with some 15,000 Chinese lanterns.

15 Yamaga Lantern Festival (Yamaga City, Kumamoto Prefecture) Kumamoto Prefecture's nationally famous summer festival is held in mid August. Decorated lanterns announce the opening of the festival on that day. Experience the fantastic atmosphere of a thousand women dancing with paper lanterns on their head. their heads.

16 Takachiho Night Kagura (Takachiho-cho, Miyazaki Prefecture) Held from late November through to early February every year, kagura performances (traditional sacred music and dancing dedicated to the gods) are held overnight to pray for bumper crops in the coming year.





Hot Springs

A cluster of stone Buddhas carved into the mountainside has been designated as a national treasure and a national historic monument. More than 60 Buddha figures have been carved into the face of a cliff and are set slightly apart in four main clusters known as: Hoki, Dougasako, Sannosan and Furuzono. Among them, the figure of Dainichi Nyorai Buddha is distinguished by its compassionate features.

17 Huis Ten Bosch (Sasebo City, Nagasaki Prefecture) Huis Ten Bosch is a theme park with a residential resort hotel. Whenever you visit, flowers will be blooming in the European-style theme park where 17th century European streetscape and culture have been recreated.

18 Dolphin watching (Amakusa City, Kumamoto Prefecture) The coastal area around Tsuujima, Itsuwa-machi in Amakusa City is the habitat of several hundred dolphins, offering visitors the exciting experience to watch them on board boats, certain to please everyone.

19 Harmonyland (Hiji-machi, Oita Prefecture)

Its fantatic parade accompanied by Hello Kitty and the whole range of other Sanrio characters is much loved by children.

20 Phoenix Sea Gaia Resort (Miyazaki City)

The resort sits on expansive land measuring 10km in the north-south direction and consists of a hotel, convention hall, hot spring, golf course and other entertainment facilities.

21 Beppu Hatto (Beppu City, Oita Prefecture) Beppu, a hot spring resort, boasts the world's greatest number of hot springs sources yielding abundant hot spring water greatest in Japan. There are eight hot springs in the city called Beppu Hatto each with its own distinctive characteristics.

22 Ureshino Hot Spring (Ureshino City, Saga Prefecture)

Ureshino has long been known as a hot-spring resort in Saga. Its hot spring water is known as one of the Japan's bihadan-no-yu (good for producing a smooth complexion). The streets are lined with traditional Japanese-style hotels with a long tradition in averuicit o guiding. in exquisite cuisine.

23 Unzen Hot Springs (Uuzen City, Nagasaki Prefecture)

Designated Japan's first national park in 1934, Unzen is also known as a resort. Unzen Jigoku with hot spring steam filling the air has a concentration of hot spring inns and hotels nearby.

24 Kurokawa Hot Spring (Minami Oguni-machi, Kumamoto Prefecture)

It is the fashion in Kurokawa Hot Spring to take a number of therapeutic baths, visitors can stroll around the town and make bathtub tours. Most of the hotels and inns have outdoor baths made with large rocks where you can enjoy a steady stream of relaxing hot-spring water cascading onto your back

25 Yufuin Hot Spring (Yufu City, Oita Prefecture)

Yufuin Hot Spring having a number of older inns, modern Japanese-style hotels (with various kinds of services and entertainments) and boarding houses side-by-side enjoys high popularity in Kyushu.

26 Ibusuki sand-steamed spring (Ibusuki City, Kagochima Prefecture) A very rare type of hot spring, done by bathing in the beach sand warmed by geothermal heat.

29 Mogi Loquats (Nagasaki Prefecture) More than 40 % of the loquat crop is produced in Nagasaki Prefecture. The Mogi loquat with a less acidic taste is a common wright and tract

30 Honmaru-gozen (Kumamoto City) The ceremonial cuisine style of the saumurai, it is offered to give visitors experience in the olden days of the Kumamoto feudal domain, with dishes unique to each season prepared to cater to the modern palate.

Seki-aji (jack mackerel) & 31 Seki-saba (mackerel) (Oita City) Fish found in the rich waters of the Bungo Strait where 2 ocean currents clash, caught with poles rather than nets for treshness.

Kagoshima kuro-buta pork (Kagochima Prefecture) One of Japan's leading pork brand, known for its sweet, tender and succulent meat raised in Kagoshima's rich natural resources. mango is truly the king of fruit with its tantalizing sweetness due to its high sugar content of 18 Brix or more.


